REORGANIZATION MEETING
JANUARY 3, 2022

(This meeting was held in-person and virtually/telephonically due to COVID-19)

The Reorganization Meeting of the Moorestown Township Council was called to order by Mayor Gillespie at Town Hall, Council Chambers, 111 West Second Street, Moorestown at 7:03 p.m. Attendance was as follows:

OPENING STATEMENT: Mayor Gillespie read the Open Public Meetings Act statement in full, as printed on the agenda.

"Notice of the Reorganization Meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act" by:

1. Posting a copy of the meeting notice and agenda on the bulletin board at the Municipal Complex.

4. Forwarding written notice to each person who has requested copies of the regular meeting schedule.

All of the above posting, filing and mailing have taken place on the 14th day of December, 2021 (meeting notice) and 30th day of December, 2021 (agenda).

MOMENT OF SILENCE AND FLAG SALUTE: Mayor Gillespie asked all to stand for a moment of silence and the flag salute.

STATEMENT OF ELECTION FOR MEMBERS OF TOWNSHIP COUNCIL: Mayor Gillespie read the following statement into the record: This shall certify that Quinton Law, with a total of 4,634 votes, officially won the November 2, 2021 election for Moorestown Township Council (fulfilling the unexpired term of Brian Donnelly).

ADMINISTRATION OF OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY ELECTED TOWNSHIP COUNCIL MEMBER, QUINTON LAW: Congressman Andy Kim administered the oath of office to Quinton Law, Council Member.

ELECTION OF DEPUTY MAYOR - TERM TO EXPIRE DECEMBER 31, 2022:

Mayor Gillespie called for the election of Deputy Mayor.

Congressman Andy Kim administered the oath of office for Deputy Mayor to Ms. Mammarella.

COMMENTS BY CONGRESSMAN ANDY KIM: Congressman Kim congratulated Council. He spoke to the residents about the challenging times all are facing and indicated that all need to work together through these times. Congressman Kim noted that he and his wife have chosen to raise their children in Moorestown and he trusts this Council with making decisions for the wellbeing of his family and the residents and working together in tough times. He thanked everyone. Mayor Gillespie thanked Congressman Kim.

COUNCIL COMMENTS: Mr. Law thanked the Mayor, Council, Congressman Kim and the public for attending the meeting. He thanked Congressman Kim for his service. He stated that this has been an incredible year and that he is proud to have taken part in it. He thanked his family and staff for their support, as well as those who he serves with on committees. He looked forward to the work ahead (supporting local businesses; expanding open space; taking care of the environment; providing services that the residents expect; engaging the public on issues that are important to them such as speeding, upgrading parks, paving roads, etc.). He thanked the voters for electing him and he looked forward to doing the work he was elected to do, noting that he is very proud to serve this community.

Mr. Zipin thanked his fellow Council members and staff, noting the challenging year that has passed and he looked forward to moving forward with the goals that have been set in the coming year. He noted that staff did well in moving business forward in spite of the hand that was dealt with COVID; and that in spite of the technical difficulties that were experienced with meetings, he feels that Council has continued to achieve its goals as they relate to transparency. He felt that the challenges all have faced with COVID over the past couple of years and the barriers that residents have with attending meetings, no matter the many reasons, have broken down a barrier in that a way was made for everyone to have access to meetings no matter their location. He noted the value of things that have come from the wake over the past couple of years. He looked forward to supporting and keeping existing businesses in town and bringing new business. He announced the opening of a new COVID testing site on Pleasant Valley Avenue. He wished all a happy and healthy 2022.

Mr. Van Dyken noted that he was attending the meeting virtually. He noted that having started on Council a year ago, despite COVID, he and Council have managed to reach many goals (supported outdoor dining; brought forward brewery, distribution and cannabis licensing to town; held multiple festivals to get people outdoors, while creating a sense of community; provided continued compliance with affordable housing obligations; supported the needs of the police department; responded to concerns of the residents, etc.). He advised that it has been a pleasure serving with Council and on the Sustainable Moorestown and Recreation Advisory Committees. He commended them for their work. He felt that Council's decision to bring Doug Heinold in as the Township Attorney and Kevin Aberant as Township Manager were excellent decisions and the Township has an excellent team in place. He thanked his family for its support while he serves. He wished all a Happy New Year.

Ms. Mammarella thanked the Mayor and Council. She acknowledged the hard times of this past year noting that, in spite of all the adversity, same helped her to see all the good and all the incredible had work people do; it has strengthened her gratitude.

Ms. Mammarella expressed her appreciation in being elected as Deputy Mayor again this year. She noted the hardships brought on by the pandemic over the past year and her hardship going through cancer treatment over the year; she expressed her great appreciation to all that showered her with love and concern over the year. She extended a sincere appreciation to her husband and family for their support over the year. She thanked Council, especially mentioning the Mayor, and all their support. She thanked the Township staff, public works, police and fire for all they do.

Ms. Mammarella reiterated her commitment to keeping taxes down and spending Township funds wisely while maintaining the great services provided to the residents. She reiterated her commitment to supporting the businesses in town. She noted that, under the leadership of the Mayor, Council was able to: solidify the Township's outdoor dining ordinances; gain additional revenue from liquor licenses that opened up; precipitate revenue through the cannabis market (noting the Township's leadership in being ready to move forward when the law State law took effect); create the redevelopment zone at the mall complex; authorize the COVID mega site at the mall and the new testing site on Pleasant Valley Avenue; create the Moorestown Better Together Task Force.

Ms. Mammarella advised that, in trying to find ways to become more unified and understanding, she participated in a program sponsored by Moore Unity called "Our Story, Brave Conversations on Race" where, once a week for six weeks, five people of color and five white people got together and talked about their experiences and issues. She noted what a great experience it was and encouraged others to attend.

This this year, she wants to: look at historic preservation in order to preserve and protect the town's landmarks and architecture; see the wi-fi program progressing in order to afford people an opportunity of choice; see the Lenola Streetscape Improvement project moving forward and the completion of Percheron Park.

Ms. Mammarella expressed her appreciation to the 130 board and committee members that serve in this town and hoped that Council would be able to hold the Annual Boards and Committees Appreciation Dinner this year (as it has not been able to the past two years due to COVID).

Mayor Gillespie thanked all present for their attendance and Council for its commitment in attendance over the past year. She thanked the Township staff and professionals for all they do in keeping the town running so well. She congratulated Ms. Mammarella and Mr. Law. She said she looked back on her notes from 2020 at which time she said, without knowing what change was coming, “change is inevitable but progress is optional.” She said in the midst of serving the past two years through a global pandemic that has changed almost everything about our lives, Council has made progress on a number of issues and it is committed to continuing in the trajectory.

Mayor Gillespie stated that Council kept its promise on bringing new revenues to town and improving upon the town’s infrastructure (water treatment plants, improvements to water towers, repaving of thirteen township roads, with additional roadwork plans for this year.) She acknowledged that East Main Street is in poor condition and has been for many years. However, as bad as that is, the 100-year old concrete water main that runs from the Kings Highway Water Treatment Plant to Poplar Avenue is in much worse shape. That issue needs to be dealt with first or the town could be facing catastrophic failures that will leave hundreds of businesses and homes without water. This year, the Township will begin to replace that water main (starting at Kings Highway Water Treatment Plant to North Church Street and resurfacing East Main Street from, Poplar to Marter Avenues.

Mayor Gillespie advised that the Lenola Streetscape project is on schedule; construction is anticipated in late summer or early fall. While there were set backs with the Percheron Park project, Council is working on solutions and it hopes to have the park completed by early summer.

Mayor Gillespie advised that last year in March, the Township received a conditional judgment of compliance in connection with its affordable housing obligations; and she was pleased to announce that the Township will be wrapping up the final details of those conditions soon; and it is expecting a final judgment of compliance. She advised that the judgment of compliance is what the Township has been working towards for many years (prior to when she started on Council) and it will allow the Township to retain its zoning and prevent profit-driven overdevelopment in our town. Mayor Gillespie announced that the Township’s plan for one-hundred percent development at Hartford and East Gate has received over \$1,000,000 in federal tax credits; that is money the Township would have had to contribute toward the project. Construction is expected to begin there and at the mall (residential units) later this year.

Another big addition to the town is Cooper Health’s residency at the mall site; construction is expected to begin in the spring. Brightcore Energy has received funding from the State to install nineteen new solar projects in the Township’s business districts; this is part of New Jersey’s solar program and at least fifty-one percent of the clean energy generated by those projects will be allocated to low and moderate incoming housing families in Moorestown and

adjacent communities at a twenty-percent discount. That award and some other big environmental stewardship initiatives, like the plastic bag ban that will take effect in May, and work by the Sustainable Moorestown Committee, has led Council to start thinking about 2022 as “The Year of the Environment in Moorestown.” She said Moorestown is going to start doing things and talking about them so it can get better. Each quarter will be focused on a specific theme and this first quarter will be started with energy use. This will be a year that Moorestown can explore and learn together on changes that need to be made now and it will start developing plans for bigger and more impactful changes. Mayor Gillespie asked all to stay tuned and follow the Township’s social media pages.

Mayor Gillespie advised that Council has worked hard for the past few years to balance committee membership and to ensure that the volunteers serving have appropriate expertise and commitment. She said the volunteerism in town is second-to-none; however, the Code that spells out their responsibilities and how they are organized is out of date and inconsistent. She said Council owes it to the volunteers to clarify what they are being asked to do and to ensure it is using the tremendous expertise it has in town to make the very best decisions for the community. With that in mind, Council will seek input from the committees about their charters; what they do; and how they understand their roles, with the goal of having an updated and more consistent Code by the end of this year. She thanked all again stating, let us get started, we have a lot of work to do this year.

ANNOUNCEMENTS BY MAYOR OF APPOINTMENTS: Mayor Gillespie announced the reappointment of Chris Chesner as Class II Member of the Planning Board with a term expiring on December 31, 2022 and Deanne Bertino as a Member of the Library Board of Trustees with a term expiring December 31, 2026. We are grateful their service and commitment to town.

APPOINTMENT RESOLUTIONS: Mayor Gillespie opened the floor for public comment. There being no comment, the floor was closed.

Mayor Gillespie asked for Council comments. There were none.
